**Department of Public Works joins Earth Day Festival with  
E-cycle Day and truckload sale of  
compost bins and water barrels**

The City of Richmond Department of Public Works helping residents join in with Mayor Dwight C. Jones sustainability initiatives. DPW encourages residents to participate in the Richmond Earth Day Festival on Saturday, April 23, by recycling unwanted household electronic items at its E-Cycle Day.

The E-cycle Day event will take place from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the parking lot of Art Works, Inc., 320 Hull Street, at the corner of Hull Street and 4<sup>th</sup> Street. There is a \$7 recycling fee for televisions. All other household electronic items, such as computers, monitors, fax machines, microwaves, camcorders, etc., will be recycled free of charge. Fluorescent light bulbs and large appliances cannot be accepted.

DPW and the Clean City Commission also will hold a truckload sale during the festival. The public can purchase the Earth Machine© compost bin and the System© water barrel at discounted prices. The compost bin will be priced at \$50; the water barrel will cost \$60.

The truckload sale will run from noon until 7 p.m. at the corner of Decatur Street and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
